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"Sekai ga Sensei (The World Is the Teacher)" A Cross-Cultural Learning Project

What kind of project is it?

International students (graduate and undergraduate) studying in Niigata Prefecture will be asked to visit schools, community centers, or other facilities in Nagaoka City as lecturers in order to promote mutual understanding among participants through learning about each other's history, culture, lifestyle, and customs.

What activities are expected?

International students will be asked to give lectures or presentations to participants about your country in various ways, for instance by:

- · showing photographs using slides.
- · showing your ethnic outfits and letting participants wear them.
- introducing music from your country by playing CDs.
- · introducing ethnic dishes by cooking with participants.
- having a good time with participants by playing games from your country.

Eligibility for Entry

International students who:

- ① are enrolled as graduate or undergraduate students in colleges, universities, or graduate schools in Niigata Prefecture.
- 2 are good speakers of Japanese or English.
- 3 are able to commit themselves to this project for a minimum of one year.

A coordinator from
the Nagaoka City International
Affairs Center will support you
throughout the entire process, from
the request for your lecture to

accompanying you to the event site,

so you do not need to worry.

Compensation

- Honorarium for presentations: ¥8,000 per session (withholding a 10.21% income tax) (Except for cases in which a bilateral tax agreement is applicable.)
- Honorarium for briefing with a host school: \(\pm\) 1,000 (withholding a 10.21% income tax) (Except for cases in which a bilateral tax agreement is applicable.)
- Transportation expenses will be provided for international students living outside of the city boundary.
- Transportation expenses will not be provided for your screening interview.
